THEOLOGICAL FOUNDATIONS

Three Basic Truths

In the middle school years, kids are beginning to personalize and own their own faith.

I will follow Jesus because He knows me better than I know myself.

I will love God because God will never stop loving me.

I will live out God's story so others can know who Jesus is.





PHASE

The Middle School Phase

Sixth-Eighth Grade



→ What is a phase?

A phase is a timeframe in a kid's life when you can leverage distinctive opportunities to influence their future.

At each phase, your job is simple ...

Know what can be expected of them and know how they think so they will hear what you say and know what to do.

→ Thinks like ...

A middle schooler thinks like an engineer.

Engineers solve problems by connecting concepts so they work together.

Like an engineer, middle schoolers learn best when they personalize an idea by connecting pieces of information. They can think more abstractly, understand multiple perspectives, and think critically about themselves and others. Keep instruction clear and simple if you hope to be heard.

→ How They Relate to God ...

God's story redeems my story.

Middle schoolers who think like engineers need to know that God can rebuild a story—even when things haven't gone according to the plan. They relate to a God who overcomes impossible odds to rebuild what is broken, bring stability, restore peace, resolve doubt, give hope, and redeem everyone.

→ Wants to know ...

In middle school, tweens and teens challenge authority and personalize what they believe.

The way a middle schooler resolves the "Who...?" questions determines the framework for their relational stability.

The best way to resolve a middle schooler's relational questions is to affirm their personal journey.

Who do I like? Who likes me?

Sixth graders need an overdose of acceptance to combat the storm of changes. When adults recruit other affirming leaders and peers, kids gain stability.

Who am I?

Seventh graders are increasingly selfaware and self-conscious. When adults acknowledge positive qualities and strengths, kids discover uniqueness.

Who do I want to be?

Eighth graders can set goals, build their own plans, and follow through on them. When adults patiently support the process, students experience purpose.

It's just a phase, so don't miss it.

Renowned author and theologian Henri Nouwen defined three lies about identity: I am what I have. I am what I do. And I am what others think of me. This series encourages middle schoolers to consider that I am made for more than what I have, I am made for more than what I (can) do, I am made for more than what others think of me, and your Creator determines your worth and value.

SERIES DESCRIPTION

SERIES DESCRIPTION

Middle schoolers care about being authentic, but does "being real" always match who they truly are? In "Be For Real," students will dig into what it means to live with integrity— where who they are lines up with how they live. Over four weeks, they'll explore how integrity impacts every area of their lives—personal integrity, relational integrity, and sexual integrity. This series isn't about following rules; it's about becoming the whole person God created them to be. With integrity, students can build a life on a solid foundation that sets them up for a lifetime of being real in the best way possible.

WEEKS OF CONTENT

Week 1: Integrity does what's right.

SERIES DESCRIPTION

We all have memories of situations we wished would have been different. In "Remember When I . . . ?," students will explore what it means to forgive and why it matters for their own peace. Over three weeks, they'll see that forgiveness isn't about erasing what happened but about choosing to embrace forgiveness. As they learn from the authors of the Scriptures, students will discover that forgiveness is a powerful choice that frees them to move forward, offering the same grace that they've been given. Forgiveness is something that can change everything.

Middle schoolers create content every day—from posts on social media to art in their journals, even to notes they pass in class. "Let's Talk About . . . Creating Content" is a one-week focus on how what middle schoolers create reflects who they are and who they're becoming. This installment of "Let's Talk About . . ." encourages students to ask: Is my content true, kind, and helpful? With Jesus' words in mind, they'll explore how they can create with purpose and integrity. This is a chance to think about their influence and make sure that what they put out into the world brings out the best in themselves and others.

WEEKS OF CONTENT

Week 1: Create content that is kind to yourself and others. → Matthew 6:19-21 NRSV

And don't jump all over them every time they do or say something you don't agree with—even when it seems that they are strong on opinions but weak in the faith department. Remember, they have their own history to deal with. Treat them gently.

SERIES DESCRIPTION

Everyone loves a comeback, and this Easter series, "The Comeback Kid," centers on the greatest one ever! Over these four weeks, students will walk through Jesus' story, from an incredible miracle to His ultimate comeback from death. They'll see how Jesus' story isn't just a great comeback; it's one that gives us hope, help, and purpose. As they celebrate Easter, they'll discover that Jesus' resurrection makes Him trustworthy and gives them the courage to live with purpose. This series invites students to experience the hope that comes from following the ultimate Comeback Kid.

WEEKS OF CONTENT
